My industrious neighbors take punctilious care of their garden and front yard and I can only look on with admiration. I cannot emulate them. In truth, I would not. Such punctiliousness would take too much of my time and attention. I have to sadly reflect that life is a matter of choices. If I have to choose between the perfect home and a decentenough home, the balance is loaded on the side that lets me pursue my stronger interests.

The investment of time and effort, besides the expense, would have barred other, dearer pursuits. A friend told me the other day that the fact that poor people largely play football, middle-class people choose tennis and rich people prefer golf, shows that affluence reduces the object of your affection – the size of the ball.



Tesla: Inventor of the Modern

I have been wanting to read a biography of Nicola Tesla (1856-1943) for a while, so I checked "Tesla: Inventor of the Modern" by Richard Munson out of the local library. I admired the way Munson

describes Tesla's trial and tribulation, brilliance and weaknesses, and fame and fall.

Edison and Westinghouse figure very prominently in Tesla's life, one foe and another a friend. The stories of Tesla's rivalry with Edison and cooperation with Westinghouse are fascinating.

Tesla started his life in Serbia in 1856 and came to the U.S.A. in 1884. In the beginning, he worked for Edison, whose company was installing the first electric lighting in American cities using complex direct current generators, which were limited to transmitting short distances and suitable only for electric lighting.

While Edison stuck to the DC current, Tesla had been working on an efficient alternating current system. Edison rejected this concept and despised Tesla for that

reason. However, George Westinghouse saw the value in workaholic and eccentric Tesla's approach. Ultimately, Tesla's approach emerged victorious over inflexible and rigid Edison. His AC current generation dramatically expanded the potential market for electricity, allowing it to be sold not just at night for lighting but also during the day for factories, appliances, and streetcar lines. In contrast to DC current, AC could be pumped for hundreds of miles and could efficiently power machines as well as lamps.

That made Tesla a wealthy celebrity whose lectures thrilled audiences with demonstrations of spectacular electrical phenomena. Tesla continued to invent and patent essential features of the radio, wireless telegraphy, and even computers.

Some of Tesla's concepts were too farfetched such as wireless power transmission. His latter ideas were deemed impractical by Investors. Many of his predictions were dismissed as wacky and unimplementable. As the author notes, "he believed the joy of inventing went beyond the accumulation of profits."

Like another genius, Howard Hughes, Tesla spent his last days as a recluse and penniless. It's a tragic but beautiful story told by Munson and I find the drama as tragic as Shakespeare's Hamlet or Macbeth.

India was divided into two parts in 1947 as the Muslims wanted their own Islamic nation called Pakistan. The Muslim population in India in 1947 was 94 million and now it is 195

The killing of Hindus by them is nothing new. They regularly try to marry Hindu girls converting them to Islam first. Recently they murdered



Hindu girls for not marrying them by cutting their bodies in pieces. It's very common for them to block public roads for doing namaz (worship).

The Muslims started coming to India in the 13th century. They were invaders, and plunderers and converted the Hindus to Islam through mass killing. Thousands of Hindu women preferred to burn themselves to death instead of accepting Islam. The western media talks about the Hindus killing Muslims in Gujarat in February 2002, but they don't talk about the Muslims burning train full of Hindu pilgrims and killing them first. The Gujarat riot was retaliation by Hindus for their (Muslims) despicable act.

Many Hindus in India resent Muslims because the latter still show allegiance to neighboring Pakistan. It's not uncommon for them to display Pakistani flags on their buildings instead of the Indian flag. During the sporting events, they openly cheer for Pakistan instead of backing the Indian team.

The Muslims in India usually shelter Pakistani terrorists and spies in mosques and their homes. Recently, two Nagaur (a city in India) residents were arrested by Delhi police on charges of spying for Pakistan's intelligence agency and had fought the 2013 assembly elections as an independent and the other was an imam at a local mosque according to a police report. Another Muslim, Abdul Jabbar, the owner of Basheer guest house in the Jama Masjid area, Delhi was arrested and taken to Bhopal for his alleged links with the Pakistani spy agency, ISI. These are common occurrences in India.

Several revelations have come to the fore by the investigating agencies in India that Muslim organizations like PFI were encouraging Muslim youth to join terror organizations like ISIS and Al Qaeda, and how they were setting up training centers to plan an attack against PM Modi during one of his Bihar rallies and their bonechilling plans to convert India into an Islamic nation.

Amid the ongoing crackdown against the radical Islamist outfit, there are several Muslim "intellectuals" who have come out in support of PFI. The day is not far when the Muslims of India will start killing the Hindus and will convert India into an Islamic state.

council meetings on policy." King Cyrus (r. c. 550-530 BCE) established the Persian paradigm of freedom of religion and expression in his empire, providing a level of autonomy to women of every

class. In ancient Iran, women could travel on their own, the king's mother, wife, and daughters had also their own entourage, and staff to attend to their needs, and were given places of honor at banquets." (Parsa, Fariba, March 3, 2021, In the Face of Islamic Law Iranian Women Are Reappropriating Ancient Persian Culture, The Middle East Institute (MEI)).

Coming to the current perspective, a massive wave of protests has erupted all over Iran after the tragic death of an Iranian woman, Mahsa Amini. Amini was arrested by the Iranian morality police on September 17, 2022, for not wearing a hijab in public properly. While in custody, she died of a head injury. Just a note that this kind of uprising by women is unheard of in the Arab world (with some exceptions in Lebanon).

In Iran, the presence of forces such as the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) has, until now, made similar large-scale protests hard to achieve. Indeed, the regime has clung to power despite growing anti-regime sentiment and demonstrations in the last few years. Nevertheless, the current wave of protests has actually prompted a change in rhetoric on the part of Iran's conservative leaders, including President Ebrahim Raisi who talked about the necessity of changing the way of working and giving people more opportunities for the right to protest and criticize.

This time the Iranian women's protest is different from previous recent protests inasmuch as the current protests represent a geographically, ethnically, and economically diverse cross-section of Iranian society. Women, estimated to number more than 40 million in Iran, along with Iran's youth population are at the forefront of the protests, which support a vast network of popular groups and political clusters inside and outside Iran. These protests also represent a turning point due to the political, economic, and social nature of the protestors' slogans, including "Woman, Life, Freedom," "We Don't Want the Islamic Republic,"" I Will Kill, I Will Kill, Those Who Killed My Sister," "Death to the Dictator," "We are all Mahsa, We Are All in This Fight Together."

The economic crisis, public protests, and internal conflicts within the Iranian ruling class are ominous signs for the present Islamic regime. Of course, it is not yet a given that this new wave of protest, though different, will immediately alter the political system through revolution or radical change. Although it is possible that the government of Iran may purge the protest by using punitive majors, the old spirit of the Persian women has reemerged.

Health Talk

Clinical Management of Stab Wound Victims Niru Prasad MD

Given the tremendous increase in the crime rate in United States, it is very important for paramedics to learn the basic concept of initial assessment and stabilization of severely injured patients. Trauma is one of the major leading causes of death for Americans under forty and the initial assessment and stabilization of the patient strongly influences the ultimate outcome for the severely traumatized patient. Most jurisdictions require that injuries arising from acts of violence such as gunshot wounds, stab wounds be reported to the local police. A fundamental point to remember regarding blunt and penetrating trauma is that a patient who has been stabbed may also have been beaten and kicked and subsequently has sustained both blunt and penetrating injury to the body. Pathophysiology of the stab wound.

A. Penetrating injury to the body usually results in a hemorrhage from the penetration to a major vessel or solid organ.

B. Perforation of a segment of bowel or bladder.

The victim usually presents with altered mental status, hypoxia, paralysis, unequal pupils, shock, or active major bleeding. The signs and symptoms depend upon which part of the body is involved. Stab wound to the head and neck area. Penetrating injury to the head causes an altered level of consciousness, which is the hallmark of brain injury. A stab wound to the head area may produce brain contusion,

concussion, and massive intracranial hemorrhage due to epidural, subdural, and subarachnoid hemorrhage. All foreign bodies protruding from the skull should be left as they are, since they act like taemponade to control the bleeding. Penetrating injury to the neck area causes:

- A. Hemorrhage due to laceration of a major vessel.
- B. Paralysis due to damage of the spinal cord or fracture of a cervical vertebra.
- C. Hypoventilation due to paralysis of intercostal muscles and involvement of C3 through C5 spinal cord segments.

Stab Wound to the scalp area causing extensive laceration.

- A. Bleeding from a scalp laceration may be extensive, often flap type laceration.
- B. The flap should gently be replaced over the wound.
- C. Compression is applied with a dry sterile bandage.
- D. Once bleeding is controlled, the dressing can be secured with a soft roller bandage.

Penetrating injury to the chest.

A stab wound sustained to the chest area may cause tension pneumothorax, open pneumothorax, massive hemothorax, sucking chest wound, flail chest due to fracture ribs, and pericardial tamponade. The victim can also suffer from severe respiratory distress due to hypoxia, which results from:

- A. Diminished blood volume due to bleeding.
- B. Contusion of the lungs leading to ventilation failure.
- C. Changes in the pressure relationship within the pleural space leading to displacement of mediastinal structures and collapse of the lung.

Since hypoxia is the most important feature of chest injury, early intervention is designed to ensure that an adequate amount of oxygen is delivered to the portions of the lung capable of normal ventilation and perfusion. Tension pneumothorax develops when a one- way valve air leak occurs, either from the lung or through the chest wall. The presence of air in the thoracic cavity causes collapse of the lung, mediastinal shift to the opposite side causing interference with venous return, and compression of ventilation to the other lung. Open pneumothorax causes noisy breathing, and bubbling air and blood from the wound.

Massive hemothorax results from the stab wound disrupting the systemic or pulmonary vessel, and occurs with a loss of 1500 cc or more of blood in the chest cavity. The neck veins may be flat due to severe hypovolemia, or distended due to the mechanical effects of the chest cavity full of blood.

Flail chest develops when a segment of the chest wall does not have any bony continuity with the rest of the thoracic cage.

Pericardial tamponade is caused by a stab wound to the anterior chest area. This frequently leads to a collection of blood in the pericardial sac and a rupture of the aorta or cardiac muscle.

Some further potentially lethal chest injuries caused by stab wounds are:

- A. Pulmonary contusion.
- B. Disruption of the aorta.
- C. Tracheobronchial disruption.
- D. Esophageal disruption.
- E. Traumatic diaphragmatic hernia.
- F. Myocardial contusion.

Stab wound to the chest:

- A. Penetrating trauma to the chest
- B. The moving object penetrates through the chest.
- C. Cardiac tamponade A penetrating heart wound causes bleeding into the pericardial sac, collection of blood constricts the heart and impairs heart function.
- D. Tension pneumothorax stab wound to the chest puncture's the lungs and creates a valve like opening in the chest wall. The increase in pleural pressure causes mediastinal shift, decrease in cardiac output, and diminished function of the other lung.

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
